ATTACHMENT TO WAYNE TOWNSHIP FEE SCHEDULE STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PLANS

Adopted March 10, 2001 Amended August 15, 2001 Amended June 19, 2013

A Stormwater Management Plan must be prepared by a civil engineer subject to approval by the Township Engineer as part of Subdivision, Land Development and all new home Construction. The Applicant should obtain a copy of this plan from the developer if part of a subdivision, and is responsible for the implementation of the items included in that plan.

To ensure compliance with the requirements of the plan, the Township has adopted the following fee schedule and procedure.

FEE: All applicants must establish a financial assurance for the installation of stormwater control to the issuance of a zoning permit. The guarantee must be in the form of a Personal Check, Money Order, Cashiers Check or a Letter of Credit in the amount of \$2,500.00 for Residential and \$5,000.00 for Commercial.

INSPECTIONS

The Township Engineer will conduct a minimum of three inspections: WJP ENGINEERS 570-622-4550.

It shall be the responsibility of the applicant to notify the Township Engineer seventy-two (72) hours in advance of the completion of each identified phase of development.

Initial Inspection - To be conducted after construction has started, when clearing of the lot is complete and temporary erosion and sediment control measures are in place. This inspection will ensure the erosion controls are being implemented and allow discussion of permanent controls to be constructed.

Second Inspection – This inspection will be conducted during construction, at the discretion of the Township. It is intended to ensure that the permanent controls are being constructed according to the plan.) For more complex projects, added inspections in this phase of construction may be required.)

Final Inspections – To be conducted upon completion of construction, to determine if the proposed work has been completed.

Within forty-eight (48 hours) after completion or work the applicant shall notify the Township Engineer so he may conduct a final inspection.

If necessary, the township may schedule other inspections to ensure that work is being constructed according to the approved plan.
