

ROADMASTER REPORT 1860

All of Wayne Township is trying to cope with the high cost of everything right now. Gas for your car, heating oil for your house, supplies for your vehicles and homes are at an all time high, that is, if you can find what you need.

The cost of buying stone, black top and pipes just keeps going up. Wayne Township is going to continue to improve, repair and maintain our roads, because when you fall behind on your roads it is hard to catch back up. The roads in Wayne Township are a great asset and we plan to keep them that way.

Wayne Township will be paving about 5 miles of roads with ultra thin friction course this year. They are:

- Panther Valley Road from S.R. 3004 to Washington Township line
- Hidden Valley Road from Panther Valley Road to S.R. 3002
- Moyer's Station Road from S.R. 443 to Schwartz Valley Road

Also, there will be repairing and patching of Blue Mountain Road for 1,870 ft. and Ketner Road will be repaired and patched for 235 ft. The pipe on Kutz Road will be replaced in July or August when the water is low. A head wall will be poured around the pipe on Lutz Valley Road. There will be drainage pipe and

road repairs made on Hidden Valley Road behind the golf course. Repairs to the Bear Creek Road culvert damaged by Hurricane Ida will be done this summer.

Street sweeping of cinders will start at the end of March. Cleaning of pipes and shoulders will be in April and May. Crack sealing of the roads will be the week of April 4. Patching and road repairs will start when the black top plants reopen. Mowing along roads will start the end of May.

The playgrounds at Summit Station and Rolling View Development are going to get safety surface installed around the playground equipment this summer. The benches and tables were painted and the equipment was gone over for any repairs this winter.

In our Recreation Park along 443, there is going to be another field and parking lot installed on the south side. There is also going to be more walking trails and a foot bridge installed later in the summer.

I hope everyone has a happy and safe summer!

The organization is now approaching its second year. We now have 20+ tentative members interested and involved in planning our progress. The reason I say "tentative" is because we still have not received our 501(c) (3) permit from the state. This permit is necessary for any nonprofit organization to raise monies, such as collect membership dues and fund raising events.

This past February 12th, we sponsored a stand at the Schuylkill County History Fair which was held at the Fairlane Village Mall, Pottsville. It was our first event; you might say our "Coming Out Party". The items on display, antiques from the area and a reproduction enlarged township map from 1875.

We are planning to host a similar display and solicit membership at the upcoming County Fair in August. Hopefully we may have our 501 permit and we will be able to sign all you future members as part of our organization.

We had on display, at the mall event, the previous township history book which was published as part of the Bicentennial Celebration of 1976. Several people expressed an interest in this book and inquired if there were some available for sale. With this interest in the township history, the committee decided it would be time


to produce an "updated" book. An interesting fact, the county will celebrate their 250th anniversary in 2026 and Wayne Township will celebrate their 200th anniversary in 2027. It will be time to honor our heritage.

2022 will see many major improvements at Wayne Township Park. The Township Supervisors and Recreation Committee invite you to take advantage of outdoor opportunities at the Community Park. There are some great options for outdoor activities, and we have a lot of improvements planned for the park in 2022. The park plan is available in the township meeting room.

The township purchased the playground equipment from the Blue Mountain Elementary West construction project, and we plan to install a playground this year. The Township Supervisors authorized construction of the planned second athletic field and associated parking lot on the south side of the creek. Bids have been reviewed and the contract was awarded March 5th. Construction will start this spring and, weather permitting, the field should be ready for play this fall.

Last year the township applied for a Department of Conservation and Natural Resources grant through the Community Conservation Partnerships Program. We recently received notification that a \$129,000 grant has been awarded. We plan to use the grant funds to improve and pave the walking trail, purchase and install a walking bridge over the creek, plant the planned wildflower meadow and install the playground equipment. When the walking trail is completed, it will be approximately 8/10-mile loop around the park.

Local Scout Chase Jones is planning to furnish and install picnic tables and a cooking grill near the ponds. Chase is working on approval of his project and gathering the necessary materials. Please support Chase as he works on his service project to earn his Eagle Scout Rank.

The Wayne Township Lions Club, in coordination with the Northeast Lions Service Foundation, is planning to fund and construct a 40' X 60' pavilion with ADA access located near the new parking area and ponds. Paul Moyer detailed the plans at the March recreation committee meeting. The Lions have secured funding, obtained costs from Pioneer Pole Buildings and the recreation committee unanimously approved the plan. This park feature will provide a great opportunity for family and community gatherings and events.

This is your park. Please use the field and walking trail. The Blue Mountain Soccer Club uses the field several days a week for practice and once a week for games. If you would like to use the park for an organized event, please contact the township office a few months prior to reserve the facilities.

Many thanks to the volunteers on the recreation committee for their time and efforts. The committee members are Mike Polak, Becky Hoover, Rich Setlock, Jeff Dewald, Jeff Kramer and Ralph Fidler. Please feel free to contact any of the members with your ideas to improve our park. The Township Supervisors have also supported the improvements at the park. Please be sure to thank Stanley Fidler, Charles Ferguson and Ralph Fidler for their efforts.
